<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Before P2P, 56% of parents felt their child's education was poor and 12.5% thought their child's education was good. After our assistance, less than 9.5% still felt their child's education was poor, and over 57% reported their child's education was now good! • Before P2P, 7.5% of parents felt that they had poor access to quality healthcare, and 4.2% said that access was good. After our assistance, NO parents (0%) reported access to quality healthcare as poor, and 17% now indicate that access is good! • Before P2P, less than 9% of parents indicated their relationship with the school was good. After our assistance, that number jumped to 46%! • Before P2P, only 14.5% of families reported having a good view of their future. After our help, that increased to 76%! • Before P2P, 44.7% of families reported a poor quality of life. After our assistance that fell to less than 6.5%! AND before our help, only 20% reported have a good quality of life, and after our assistance, that jumped to over 71%!
