ECHO READING

What is it?

GEORGIA

- Echo reading is a strategy used to support students in developing appropriate fluency, tone, and inflection when reading out loud.
- When echo reading, a fluent reader (parent, teacher, etc.) will read a sentence or short passage of text aloud. Then the child will read the same sentence or passage aloud.

Parents can help by:

- Choosing a book or story on the child's reading level.
- Pointing to words as they are being read to ensure the child is tracking along.
- Modeling appropriate reading technique by maintaining a consistent pace, pausing at punctuation, and enunciating clearly.
